The individual outcomes adopted this month are listed below.




## **Eligibility denied**



Chemical Medicinal Product	Oncology	Treatment of patients with advanced solid tumors that have an NTRK gene fusion who have progressed following treatment with 1 or 2 prior TRK tyrosine kinase inhibitors (TKIs) (with or without prior chemotherapy) and have no satisfactory alternative treatments	Nonclinical + Clinical exploratory	Other
Chemical Medicinal Product	Neurology	Treatment of non-traumatic subarachnoid haemorrhage	Nonclinical + Clinical exploratory	SME
Chemical Medicinal Product	Haematology – Hemostaseology	Control of erythrocytosis either as a monotherapy or in combination with cytoreductive therapies in polycythaemia vera patients	Nonclinical + Clinical exploratory	SME


