## 1. Adoption of the draft agenda & minutes

The draft agenda and minutes from 29<sup>th</sup> September BDSG meeting were adopted without change. The minutes of the 29<sup>th</sup> September are now <u>published</u> on EMA website.

#### 2. Multi-year AI workplan

Luis Pinheiro (EMA) presented the Big Data Steering Group (BDSG) multi-year Artificial Intelligence (AI) workplan to 2028. The AI workplan was developed to manage the increasing complexity in the area of AI and the need to collaborate and coordinate activities across the EU network to maximise the value extracted from AI. The drafting of the document will be further informed by the consultation of a wide range of stakeholders at the joint HMA/EMA AI workshop, scheduled to take place on 20-21 November 2023. Feedback received during the workshop will be implemented and the final draft version will be shared with BDSG. It was noted that the final workplan will not only include a plan on a page but also a vision statement and a narrative text accompanying the identified activities in the plan. The multi-year AI workplan will be submitted for endorsement at the HMA meeting on 1 December 2023 and for adoption at the EMA Management Board meeting on 14 December 2023.

At this BDSG meeting, the group was consulted on a draft plan on a page, where activities are clustered in four swim lanes: Guidance, Policy and Product support; Tools and Technology; Training and Collaboration; Experimentation.

The group reviewed the planned activities and noted the following for EMA to consider:

 Renaming the 'Develop AI Guidance in Medicines Lifecycle, with MWP' activity, to include committees (e.g. CMHP and PRAC), as the owners of such guidance.

- List/promote 'Continued support to the evaluation of AI in medicines lifecycle' as the top activity for the Guidance, Policy and Product support swim lane (**Action**: EMA to update).
- Include additional AI guidance which is being developed as part of the Methodology Working Party (MWP) workplan.
- 'Survey the network on capability to analyse data' topic should have a timeline which precedes the 'Collaborate to enhance network-wide analytics capability' activity.
- The narrative text for the 'Implement and monitor the use of LLMs for internal regulatory use' activity should clearly indicate the array of use cases.
- The introductory text for the overall multi-year AI workplan, should acknowledge/state that the AI field is a rapidly changing area and the plan includes only high-level activities.
- Adding an additional task/bar 'Overarching observatory monitoring' (Action: EMA to update).
- The EU network strategy and EU network data strategy should be explicitly linked to this workplan (**Action**: EMA to consider).

**Action**: BDSG members to submit any final comment on the draft plan on a page to the BDSG secretariat by cob 3 November 2023.

#### 3. Ongoing AI activities in the EU Network

The group was presented with the ongoing AI activities in the EU Network via a quick-fire session. The session questions were captured and addressed in the meeting chat and colleagues were encouraged to follow up directly with the speakers in case of any additional questions on the presented content.

The co-chairs welcomed the updates and noted a lot of synergies and similar use cases identified across the Network. The group supported the idea to establish the AI inventory for the Network and document use cases and possible solutions. The group also endorsed the idea on establishing a common virtual platform for AI experimentation, however a careful consideration should be given to the GDPR compliance for such platform. Peter Arlett (EMA) reminded the group that a thorough impact assessment was completed a year ago on data protection for Darwin EU, which could inform GDPR compliance discussion for a possible AI experimentation platform in the future. In addition, an advanced assessment of data protection has been conducted by Microsoft Azure for the Agency.

Action: Peter Arlett to share lessons learnt from the data protection assessment (from Microsoft Azure) with BDSG and consider organising a dedicated webinar.

Action: EMA to consider the presented content during the review of the Multi-year AI workplan.

**Action**: the BDSG secretariat to consider organising a follow up session on ongoing AI activities in the EU Network in 6-month time.
