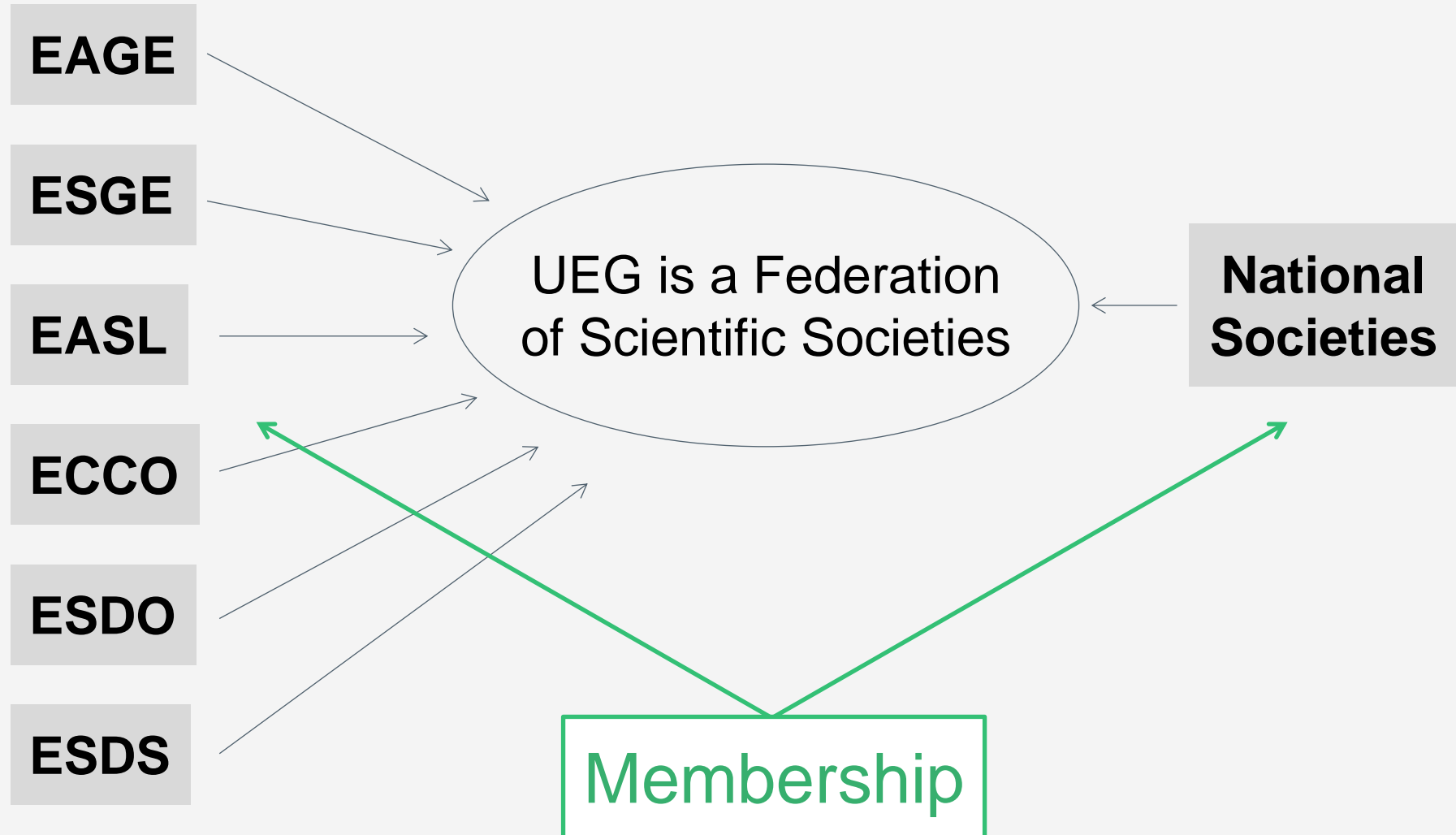

But despite its lethality and the rising burden, pancreatic cancer is a neglected disease, as policy-makers give little political attention and funding for innovative research.
